### NOTE:

No medical, liquid, or hazardous waste is accepted at the county landfills. All Special Handling Waste and industrial waste must be permitted and approved by Aiken County prior to loading for disposal.

No e-waste including computers, monitors, printers and TVs (SC DHEC code 48-60-05 through 48-60-150)

**ASBESTOS** material must have prior DHEC written authorization and County approval for disposal into a designated landfill. For more information regarding disposal call 803-642-1533.

**Mixed C&D and MSW Loads:**

Other loads of C&D (construction and demolition) and yard waste must not have lunch waste or household trash type waste mixed in the load. Proper loading will prevent your load being refused due to improperly mixed waste that will have to be separated.

**Recycling:**

The following materials are recycled by Aiken County and can be delivered, clean of other waste and separated, to the Barden C&D Landfill at `NO CHARGE!': Vehicle Batteries, Scrap Metal, and White Goods (washers, dryers, stoves). This landfill is open Monday - Saturday from 7:30 a.m. until 5:00 p.m.

These materials must be taken to any of Aiken County's 10 Convenience Centers: Cardboard, Mixed Paper (newspaper, magazines, junk mail, pasteboard, books), Aluminum Cans, Steel Cans, Soda Bottles, Milk Bottles

**Permits:**

A 2-year permit may be purchased for \$25.00; a 30-day permit is \$10.00. Permits are issued Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Each hauler is responsible for properly placing the permits on each side of the correct vehicle. Failure to place the permit on the proper vehicle could result in forfeiting access into the landfill or result in having to purchase a new permit for proper placement. Should decals become lost, damaged, or faded due to harsh detergents being used when washing vehicle or sun damage, a new permit will have to be purchased.

**Littering:**

THERE ARE STATE LAWS AND COUNTY ORDINANCES PERTAINING TO THE PROPER HAULING OF WASTE. ONE SUCH REGULATION REQUIRES THAT ALL LOADS, HOWEVER SMALL, MUST BE COVERED TO PREVENT DEBRIS BLOWING FROM A VEHICLE AND SPILLING ONTO THE HIGHWAYS OR OTHER PROPERTY. Such violations are subject to monetary fines and/or community service time.

**Billing:**

All landfill accounts are invoiced on a monthly basis and are mailed by the 5th of the month following the month you incur charges. The total bill is to be paid no later than the **30th**, unpaid accounts after this time will be assessed a delinquent fee of 10% and no less than \$8.00 per account. Landfill access will be denied until account is brought current. Payment should be sent to Finance Central Collections Division, 1930 University Parkway, Suite 3200, Aiken, SC 29801. Any unpaid accounts can be sent to Aiken County's Collection Agency along with account identifying information for collections purposes. Additional fees may be imposed by the Collection Agency

**\*\* All charges are based on fees in effect on the date of delivery as established by the Aiken County Council. \*\***

## Appendix I

### Acceptable Waste For Construction, Demolition, & Land Clearing Debris Landfills

The following types of waste have been determined by the Department to be environmentally safe and may be accepted at construction, demolition & land-clearing debris landfills unless specifically prohibited by the Department. However, any of the materials listed in this appendix that have been painted with lead-based paint and/or have been in direct contact with hazardous constituents (e.g., pesticides, etc.), or petroleum products, are prohibited from disposal at a construction, demolition, and land-clearing debris landfill.

#### **Acceptable Land-Clearing Debris Such As:**

- earthen material, e.g., clays
- sands, gravels, & silts
- logs
- tree stumps
- root mats
- top soil
- vegetation
- rock
- brush & limbs

#### **Acceptable Construction & Demolition Debris Such As:**

- structural steel
- bricks & blocks
- plaster & plasterboard
- shingles & roofing materials
- hardened/cured asphalt (2)
- pipes
- floor coverings
- other structural fabrics
- poly fiberglass (highly polished, cured material used for shower stalls, roofing, etc.)
- glass
- nonfriable asbestos-containing material (3)
- hardened concrete
- lumber
- insulation material
- floor, wall & ceiling tile
- hardened cement
- glass wire (optical fiber)
- wall coverings
- tires (1)
- other items physically attached to the structure, e.g., signs, mail-boxes, awnings, etc
- mirrors

- (1) Tires shall be reduced in size by a minimum of one-eighth the size of the original tire prior to landfill disposal.
- (2) Tar sealant material is not acceptable.
- (3) Nonfriable asbestos-containing material which is in good condition and has not been handled in such a way as to render it a regulated material and thus subject to Bureau of Air Quality Control (BAQC) Regulation 61-86.1 (Standards of Performance for Asbestos Abatement Operations) and the National Emissions Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (40 CFR 61 Subpart M) is acceptable. Record keeping of all asbestos-containing material shall be in accordance with Bureau of Air Quality Control Regulation 61-86.1 (Standards of performance for Asbestos Abatement Operations) and the National Emissions Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (40 CFR 61, and Subpart M). Prior to disposal of any nonfriable asbestos-containing material, the generator of the asbestos waste shall have a "permission for disposal" letter from the Department.

## **Appendix II Unacceptable Waste**

The following types of waste have been determined to pose a potential threat to the environment and may not be accepted at construction, demolition & land-clearing debris landfills.

**Appendix II  
Unacceptable Waste**

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**Any Waste That Has Been In Contact With Preservatives  
(pentachlorophenol & creosote) Such As:**

- railroad ties
- soil
- any mechanical part used in manufacturing processes
- utility poles
- containers

**Any Waste That Has Been In Contact With Pesticides/Herbicides Such As:**

- containers (packaging)
- soil
- mechanical/machine parts
- any equipment used for application
- vats
- concrete
- wood (storage area)

**Miscellaneous Waste Such As:**

- lamps (mercury) (1)
- liquid waste (paint, paint thinner, etc.) &
- containers (paint cans, etc.)
- caulking tubes
- unpolished fiberglass (Bondo)
- solid waste which may contain a waste or substance determined by the Department to be unacceptable.

(1) Fluorescent lamps and high intensity discharge (HID) lamps such as metal halide and mercury vapor lamps.

# LANDFILL PERMIT DECAL PLACEMENT

It is very important that you affix your new landfill permits to the correct place on your vehicle.

The new permits “must” be adhered to the right and left side (door, front panel or window) of your vehicle. This requirement enables the landfill operators to view the permit numbers when you come into the landfill and when you leave the landfill. If you go into the landfill and your sticker is not affixed in the proper place, landfill access could be denied.

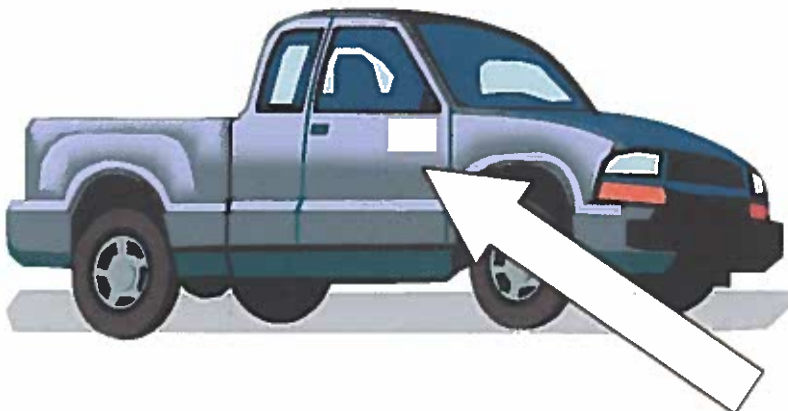

Right & Left Side Window



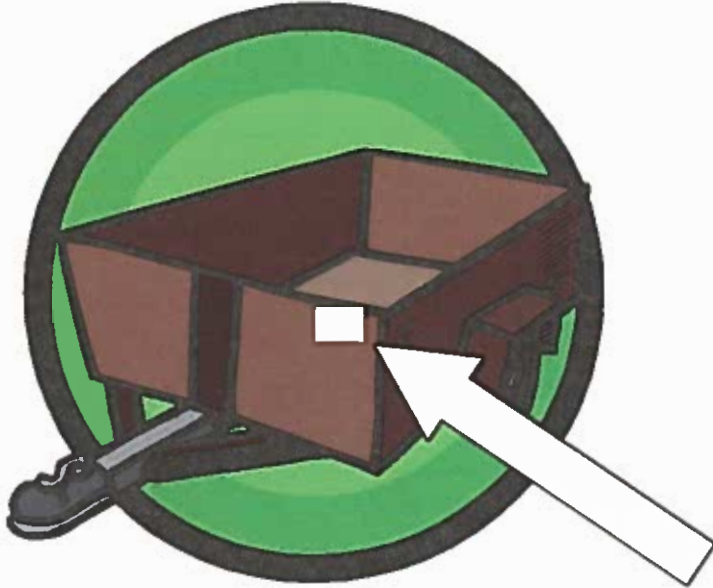

# LANDFILL PERMIT DECAL PLACEMENT- TRAILERS

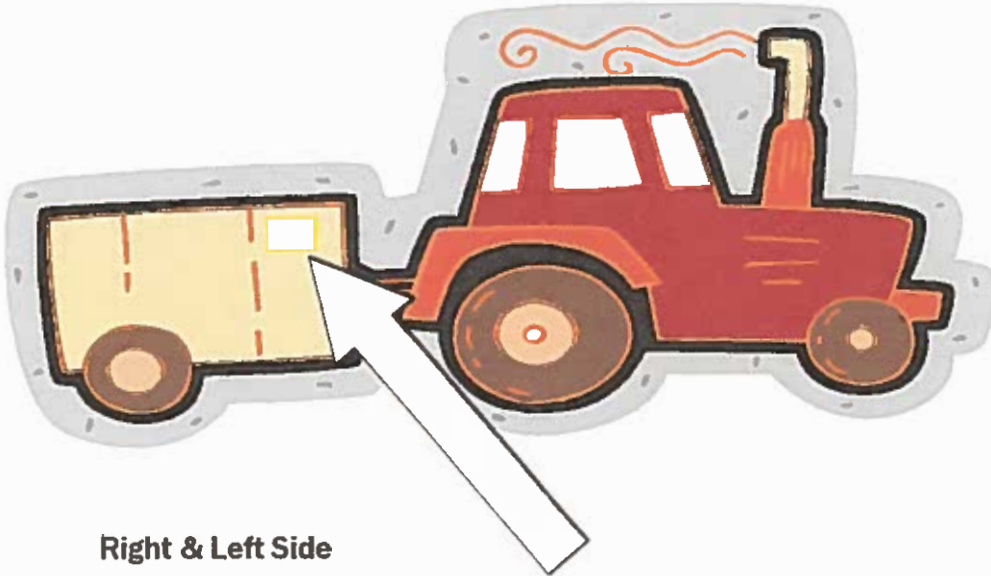
It is very important that you affix your new landfill permits to the correct place on your trailer.

The new permits “must” be adhered to the **Right and Left side** of trailer or **Rear and Front** of trailer. This requirement enables the landfill operators to view the permit numbers when you come into the landfill and when you leave the landfill. If you go into the landfill and your sticker is not affixed in the proper place, landfill access could be denied.
